Maestro William Morse continues to please crowds with his innovative programming and dynamic conducting style. Since 1999, he has been music director and principal conductor of Jefferson Symphony Orchestra, bringing outstanding musicianship and leadership to this flourishing group. He holds Bachelors and Masters degrees in Music from Oberlin Conservatory of Music and a Doctorate in Orchestral Conducting from the University of Arizona. He has studied at the Mozarteum in Salzburg, Austria, and is Professor Emeritus at Metropolitan State College, where he conducted the Symphony Orchestra and taught Advanced Conducting and Music Theory.
